**LOTTO 6/49 BONUS DRAWS CONDITIONS**  
**Approved September 8, 2011**

**1. BONUS DRAWS**

On Saturday, October 1, Wednesday, October 5, Saturday, October 8, Wednesday, October 12, Saturday, October 15, Wednesday, October 19, Saturday, October 22, Wednesday, October 26 and Saturday, October 29, 2011 (each a "**Bonus Draw Date**"), Interprovincial Lottery Corporation ("**ILC**") will cause an additional series of six different numbers between 1 to 49 to be drawn at random immediately after the LOTTO 6/49 regular draw is conducted (the "**Bonus Winning Selection**").

**2. WINNING TICKETS**

Any valid LOTTO 6/49 ticket for a Bonus Draw Date bearing the Bonus Winning Selection for that Bonus Draw Date is a Winning Ticket and entitles its holder(s) to claim:

- (a) if there is only one Winning Ticket and it bears the Bonus Winning Selection once, subject to section 5 hereof, a bonus draw prize for the Bonus Winning Selection of \$100,000 per year for life or a single cash payment of \$1,500,000, at the holder's option; or
- (b) if there is more than one Winning Ticket and/or if the Bonus Winning Selection appears more than once on a Winning Ticket, a bonus draw prize for each such Bonus Winning Selection in an amount calculated by dividing \$1,500,000 by the number of times such Bonus Winning Selection appears on the Winning Ticket(s).

**3. PRIZE CLAIMS**

Prizes must be claimed within one year of the draw date in the manner stated on the back of the Winning Ticket.

**4. ODDS OF WINNING**

The approximate odds of winning the bonus draw prize are one in 13,983,816.



**5. ANNUITY PRIZE**

**5.1 Prize Options**

The holder of the Winning Ticket referred to in section 2(a) will have the option to receive a single cash payment of \$1,500,000 in lieu of the payment or annuity of \$100,000 per year for life. The single cash payment of \$1,500,000, if chosen by the holder of the Winning Ticket, will extinguish such holder's entitlement to the annual annuity payments of \$100,000 for life. The prize option chosen by the holder of the Winning Ticket shall be final and binding upon such holder. If the holder of the Winning Ticket fails to select either the annual annuity payments or the single cash payment (or fails to provide to ILC or to ILC's third party annuity provider the information requested to process the annual annuity payments) within the time period specified by ILC for doing so, the holder of the Winning Ticket shall be deemed to have selected the single cash payment option.

**5.2 Single Cash Payment**

In the event that:

- (a) the holder of the Winning Ticket resides outside Canada at the time the claim is made; or
- (b) the holder of the Winning Ticket is other than one individual; or
- (c) ILC foresees present or future difficulties in processing the annual annuity payments;

ILC reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to award the single cash payment of \$1,500,000 in lieu of the annual annuity payments, subject to the age requirements or policies of each Regional Marketing Organization regarding the claiming of prizes, including annuity prizes.

**5.3 Death of Annuity Winner**

The minimum annuity period is 20 years.

In the event that the holder of the Winning Ticket who selected the annual annuity payments dies prior to the conclusion of the 20-year minimum annuity period, ILC may, at its option, permit an individual who is the heir or beneficiary of the holder of the Winning Ticket to receive the annuity payments for the balance of such annuity period, and ILC may require such information and written consents from such heir or beneficiary (and the heir or beneficiary will be deemed to have given the same representations, warranties and indemnities and to be subject to the same restrictions and limitations) as if the heir or beneficiary had been the original holder of the Winning Ticket. If such heir or beneficiary also dies prior to the conclusion of the original minimum annuity period, ILC shall not be required to permit any other person to receive any annuity payments.

In the event that the holder of the Winning Ticket dies after the conclusion of the 20-year minimum annuity period, the heir or beneficiary is not entitled to any amount.

**5.4 Annuity Prize not Assignable**

The annuity prize and the annual annuity payments may not be assigned, transferred, sold, loaned, leased, rented, pledged nor mortgaged or hypothecated by the holder of a Winning Ticket.

**5.5 Tax Considerations**

In the event federal and/or provincial or territorial income tax is payable on account of the annual annuity payments, ILC will calculate and remit to the tax authorities the amount of tax payable based on the highest federal and/or provincial or territorial marginal income tax rates applying to the province or territory of residence of the holder of the Winning Ticket at the draw date, so as to provide to the holder of the Winning Ticket annual annuity payments of \$100,000 net of any taxes. ILC may, however, in its sole discretion, use any other basis which it considers fair to both ILC and the holder of the Winning Ticket. No adjustment shall be made for any future change in the applicable federal and/or provincial or territorial income tax rates or if the holder of the Winning Ticket moves to a different province or territory or to a different country.

**5.6 Assignment by ILC**

ILC may assign to one or more third party annuity providers the responsibility to pay the annuity prize and ILC will not be liable for any acts or omissions of such third party annuity providers, including, without limitation, total or partial non-payment.

**6. APPLICABLE GAME CONDITIONS**

These Bonus Draws Conditions are supplemental to the ILC LOTTO 6/49 Game Conditions which are governed by the ILC Rules and Regulations Respecting Lotteries and Lottery Tickets and are available upon request.
